Moray Eel Created on Day 5

Design The shape of the moray eel allows it to hunt prey that is larger than it can swallow. When the eel captures a large prey, it will wrap itself around the victim in a sort of knot and either flatten the prey's body enough to swallow it, or tear off a piece of its prey to eat it. This predatory behavior was not part of this creature's original design since all animals were created as vegetarians. They did not hunt other animals until after the Fall of man.

Features The moray eel has a long, slender body with one long dorsal fin that runs along most of the back to the caudal fin (the tail) and into the anal fin, which runs along the underside of the body. Most species lack pectoral and pelvic fins.

A moray has sharp, thin teeth that protrude from its upper and lower jaws, and sometimes from the roof of its mouth. Its teeth point backward to prevent slippery prey from escaping.

Fun Facts The moray eel gets its color from the protective mucus it secretes that covers its body. This mucus contains a toxin in some species.

The moray has a small, circular gill on each side of its head, well behind the mouth. The mouth is kept open (and moving) to help water circulate through the gills.

This fish has poor eyesight but a very good sense of smell.
