 Evidences for the Flood. (continued)

2. Billions of Dead Things Buried in Rock Layers Laid Down by Water All Over the Earth

Around the world billions of different creatures were buried by the waters of the Flood. In the Grand Canyon we find a "fossil graveyard" where billions of squid-like nautiloids (pronounced NAWT-il-oids) were buried. It would take a lot of water to bury that many creatures! We also find land animals buried with sea creatures. In northern Tasmania we find a toothed whale and a possum buried together. Whales and possums do not live in the same place! A powerful Flood must have buried them together. We also find fossils that were buried very quickly. For example, a six-foot-long ichthyosaur (pronounced IK-thee-uh-sawr) was fossilized while she was giving birth! All of these fossils point to the global Flood as recorded in the Bible. <https://answersingenesis.org/kids/geology/evidence-flood/>
