#### Evidences for the Flood

#### 6. Bent, Not Broken, Rock Layers

If you take soft playdough and try to bend it, what happens? It bends, of course! What if you let that playdough dry out? When you try to bend it again what happens? It breaks! This same thing happens to rocks. Before they harden into solid rock, they are bendable, like soft playdough. When they get hard you can't bend them anymore because they will just crack. In many places around the world we see rock layers that are folded, or bent, without having been broken. This means the rocks had to be "wet" (like soft playdough) when they were bent. If the rock layers were slowly laid down millions of years before they were bent, they would have already dried out and thus cracked instead of folding like they did. So these rock layers cannot be millions of years old. They were



quickly laid down and then bent, all during the year of the Flood of Noah

Then Peter said unto them, Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost. Acts 2:38-41.

Baptism is God's Word in a living and dramatic form. When a Christian understands the meaning of baptism, believing the great transformation that has occurred in his life, and obeys its message, baptism becomes the means of grace and life. Thus the apostle Paul first reminds us what baptism really means:

"Don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life" (Romans 6:3,4).

Baptism means that believers are united with Christ. His death is their death; His resurrection life is their life. Then the apostle Paul applies this great Gospel truth in a practical way:

"In the same way count yourselves dead to sin, but alive to God in Christ Jesus. Therefore do not let sin reign in your mortal body so that you obey its evil desires. Do not offer the parts of your body to sin, as instruments of wickedness, but rather offer yourselves to God, as those who have been brought from death to

life; and offer the parts of your body to him as instruments of righteousness"
