Divisiveness –

Avoid foolish controversies and genealogies and arguments and quarrels about the law, because these are unprofitable and useless. Warn a divisive person once, and then warn him a second time. After that, have nothing to do with him. (Titus 3:9-10)

Personally, I love a good argument or debate. It's part of my nature. It's part of my genetic makeup. Nearly everyone in my immediate family loves a good debate. Many of my friends love a good discussion or debate. There is absolutely nothing wrong with a good discussion or debate until it turns into an argument or a quarrel. At that point it becomes very dangerous and harmful. Many years ago I read a book written by Dale Carnegie. In it he said, "No one ever wins an argument." Now hold on, I've won several arguments in my time. I proved, without a doubt, that I was right. Maybe I did prove myself to be right and the other person to be wrong, but what did

I really accomplish in doing this? What did I really prove? How did I make the other person feel? Did I really gain anything by winning the argument? **Some things in life** are worth taking a stand for, but many things are not worth it. As the apostle Paul wrote in his letter to Titus, we should avoid foolish controversies and arguments. They are unprofitable and useless.
